What have we already done this year to improve?

- ✓ Updated the website to share our curriculum plans
- ✓ Updating our Year Group pages weekly so that you know what is happening
- ✓ Curriculum development to ensure all subjects are carefully sequenced so there are high expectations and pupil outcomes from preschool to Year 6
- ✓ Participation in whole school staff training on a new NHS project around Language and Living
- ✓ Improved teaching areas with the new Year 4 classroom teaching block
- ✓ Purchased new set of iPads for increased opportunities for technology within the classroom
- Embedded a new phonics programme 'Rocket Phonics' to support our teaching of reading and writing, investing £9K into the scheme, staff training and purchasing the new books and teaching resources
- ✓ Rolled out a safeguarding system (CPOMS) to all of our staff and delivered training to ensure every staff member is confident in the role they play in keeping the children safe
- ✓ Delivered curriculum evenings and online safety meetings
- ✓ Pupil Admission Number (PAN) set at 60 from now on to ensure class sizes are smaller

What we are planning to do this year to improve?

- ✓ Look at our school communication package to bring more systems together and online (e.g. bookings)
- ✓ Ensure that when we start a new term, clubs that are continuing remain on the same day to support Owls Hoot spaces
- ✓ Share information with parents so that you know our focus for school development
- ✓ Provide dates for the diary much earlier to help you with scheduling
- ✓ Hold parent forum meetings
- ✓ Provide training for our lunchtime supervisors
