






























Main headlines for 2024:

- More children are online using phones and tablets compared to laptops and desktops.
- There has been a decrease in use of digital devices (e.g. 12% less are using phones compared to 2023).
- Over 80% of children in KS1 watch online content via Youtube.
- Over 90% of children can recall being taught about online safety (slight increase on 2023).
- Over 80% of children feel safe online either all or most of the time.
- About a third of children know what 'personal information' means.
- 80% of children know who they would speak to if they felt upset online (15% decrease on 2023).
- A quarter of children feel that everything online is true.
- Just under half of children say they spend no more than 1 hour online.
- Just over 10% say they are spending 4 or more hours each day.
- More children have limits on their screen time during the week (71%) compared to weekends (60%).
