


















Conclusions - 2025:

- More children are going online using handheld devices (phones and tablets)
- Changes since 2024
- Two thirds of children play games on console at home
- Over 80% of children are watching online content via Youtube
- Most children can recall being taught about online safety at school
- Over half of the children in KS1 feel safe online all the time
- Over half of the children know what 'personal information' means
- Just under 50% of children spend one hour or less online everyday
- 8% of children (10 pupils) spend over 4 hours online each day (slight decrease on 2024)
- Just under three quarters of children say they have a limit on their screentime during the week
- Two thirds have a limit at the weekend
