## 2023 Headlines for KS1:

- Three quarters of children use a mobile phone to go online
- Two thirds of children in KS1 own a games console
- Three quarters of children in KS1 watch content on Youtube
- 90% of children feel safe online some/most/all of the time
- Two thirds if children do not know what personal information means
- One fifth of children think that everything on the internet is true
- Just under half of children spend 1 hour or less online each day excluding school (10% more than 4 hours
- Just under two thirds of children have screentime limits during the week
- Half have screentime limits during the weekend
