2020/21 Impact on pupils' attainment and progress

During the pandemic the expectations for our pupils have remained unchanged. We have continued to monitor attainment and progress of disadvantaged pupils and compared them to the rest of their respective cohorts. These termly teacher assessments are set using summative assessment data in reading, gaps and maths. We also monitor progress in writing every half term.

Progress is also measured across the year and compared between pupil groups in these subject areas. We have found that although some eligible pupils attain lower than peers (compared to age related expectations) they make good or better progress. This information is monitored by the Senior Leadership Team, class teachers and school governors.

We offer small group tuition to all Pupil Premium children throughout the school. The children have an additional session (with their class teacher or member of the support staff from their year group). The purpose of these sessions is to work on areas for development in the core subject areas. This can comprise of additional phonic input, recapping new concepts in maths and support with areas of grammar, punctuation and spelling. Key target areas are discussed with families after these sessions and they are kept informed about progress during the term.
