The children had a wonderful experience leaning about crimes the magistrates come across on a daily basis and the punishments they can hand out. The Children were shocked to discover that the magistrates did not actually get paid for this vital role they do for the community. They explained how they got into the role and what qualifications they needed. This led to a very interesting talk about having British values and what this means for our community. Furthermore, we had a further discussion talking about jobs and having a career in the law system.

Interactive Science with Manor High School


Earlier this month, we were fortunate enough to experience a masterclass in reversible and irreversible reactions from Manor High School. The children were shown a range of exciting demonstrations and the chemistry behind each was explained. It was a thoroughly enjoyable learning experience with the children really appreciating the awe and wonder that science can bring.







Children in year 5 have been learning about the different organ systems as part of their Human Body topic this spring term. The children have been lucky enough to become surgeons for the day dissecting a heart, lungs and the trachea. This has helped children gain a deeper understanding of the circulatory system and the respiratory system. Both classes were extremely brave, although we did see a few pale faces towards the end!

Worry Monsters

We have recently launched our worry monsters, using 'The Very Hungry Worry Monsters' book as inspiration. We are encouraging children to 'feed' their worries to their class worry monster. Children can write or draw a worry and then put the paper into a closed container. This allows the children to 'contain' their worry ('containment' is a Cognitive Behavioural Therapy tool for anxiety) which makes it feel more manageable and allows them to concentrate better in the classroom. This process also makes class staff aware of a child's anxieties which they can then address with the child, if necessary, class teachers are monitored daily.

Overdale Infant School have recently participated in Arts Week alongside The Spark Arts. Our children enjoyed a live performance in school. The performance was called 'Butterflies' and it was about three friends who embark on an exciting adventure to chase their butterflies away. The performance was created in response to young children's experience of anxiety. 'Butterflies' is an uplifting tale of friendship, courage and facing your fears, told using innovative staging, breath taking physicality, touching humour and an original musical score. Following the performance, the children had the opportunity to create artwork using a range of tools and techniques. Over the week we created over 400 butterflies, and we displayed these proudly in each classroom.

We estimated that over the course of lunchtime, around 60 girls would participate, but in fact, the participation levels were in excess of 80 girls who were supported enthusiastically and respectfully by the boys.

We've made links to International Women's Day in our class collective worship sessions and all children have been able to reflect on how far the world has progressed in terms of equal opportunities for males and females, BUT we collectively agreed that more can be done!




#WORLD BOOK DAY
