
We will notify you of our grand total in future newsletters...

Have you seen the recent Reading Newsletter that we sent home to families? It was full of information and tips to encourage your child to have an enjoyment of books and encourage everyone at home to read as much as they can.

Finally, a HUGE thank you to all the children in key stage 1 that have achieved their Bronze Award sticker for reading regularly at home for the past 6 weeks. The next step will be a special certificate for 12 weeks of fantastic reading support at home.

Reading at home is the single most important way you can support your child's development at school. Without a good foundation in reading and understanding text, a child may struggle to access different areas of the school curriculum.

We want every child to be a reader by the time they move into Year 3 and build a love of books and reading as they move through key stage 2. We can only do this with your support at home.

Being safe online

With Safer Internet Day around the corner, it seems like a perfect time to talk about staying safe when your child is online.

We teach online safety alongside our computing curriculum. We teach the children that, whilst computers and technology are wonderful and amazing tools, there are risks with how they are used.

We know that many of our children are spending increased amounts of time online when they are out of school (e.g. gaming, using social media or watching online content). We want the important messages to travel home

and be used by the children all of the time.
