




We hope that you have had a relaxing Christmas break and we can't wait to hear about what you have been up to, especially what you have been reading.

Although some classes started slightly before others, before Christmas we took a look at how each class have been getting on with their bookmark stamps...



So, where will your reading take you? If you read about and take up a new skill, let Mrs Hibbard know for our next newsletter!




Ten word Tiny Tales by Joseph Coelho:
