Clubs at WGPS

We are proud of the range of clubs that we offer at Woodland Grange. In each newsletter, we will focus a different club and this month it is the turn of **Code Club**. This club has been running for many years at Woodland Grange. Children learn about coding and programming, initially using



'Scratch'. Later in the year, some of them will progress onto text based coding using a website called 'Trinket' and even BBC Micro Bits. It is wonderful to see them become more confident in their abilities. The children enjoy the club and have fun whilst learning new concepts that they can use later on in KS3 and 4. This year, we have also seen a larger number of girls attending the club which is also brilliant. Code club is open to year 5 pupils.

School Parking

We will always include reminders about parking in our monthly newsletters. We know how difficult it can be for local residents and want to do everything we can to support them. You may have seen staff issuing 'polite parking reminders' recently. We will continue to remind everyone about the correct way to park when you are dropping off or collecting your children:

- <u>Never</u> stop on the yellow zig zags outside of school
- <u>Never</u> park over or block residents driveways
- <u>Never</u> park on pavements. It will block access (for pedestrians, pushchairs or mobility scooters)
- <u>Always</u> switch off your engine when waiting to collect your children

Don't forget: You can use the Grange Farm pub car park as a park and stride venue (a 3 minute walk to/ from school). It is close to school, does not affect local residents and means you get some fresh air
