
















Having fun at Condover

Parking

We will continue to challenge poor parking on the roads close to school. We appreciate this does not apply to many families who park with care and consideration. Please remember the following:

- Do not stop on the yellow zig zags outside of school
- Do not park over or block pavements or residents driveways
- Switch off your engine when you are waiting outside of school

You can still use the Grange Farm pub car park to 'park and stride' to school. It only takes 3 minutes to walk to school, doesn't affect local residents and means you get fresh air and exercise on your way to school.
